## Lily Looks™ Tiny Diamond Lily *Lilium 'Tiny Diamond'*

### Description:

This variety is a compact lily that bears well formed, upward facing, rose-red blooms with white centers; perfect as a tabletop accent, or as an addition to a mixed container; they are also known to have multiple blooms per stem

### Features & Attributes

Lily Looks Tiny Diamond Lily features bold red trumpet-shaped flowers with white centers at the ends of the stems from early to mid summer. The flowers are excellent for cutting. Its glossy narrow leaves remain dark green in color throughout the year. The dark red stems can be quite attractive and add to the plant's interest.

This is an herbaceous houseplant with a rigidly upright and towering form. This plant may benefit from an occasional pruning to look its best.

## Plant Finder

### Planting & Growing

When grown indoors, Lily Looks Tiny Diamond Lily can be expected to grow to be about 12 inches tall at maturity extending to 16 inches tall with the flowers, with a spread of 12 inches. It grows at a fast rate, and under ideal conditions can be expected to live for approximately 10 years. This houseplant will do well in a location that gets either direct or indirect sunlight, although it will usually require a more brightly-lit environment than what artificial indoor lighting alone can provide. It does best in average to evenly moist soil, but will not tolerate standing water. The surface of the soil shouldn't be allowed to dry out completely, and so you should expect to water this plant once and possibly even twice each week. Be aware that your particular watering schedule may vary depending on its location in the room, the pot size, plant size and other conditions; if in doubt, ask one of our experts in the store for advice. It is not particular as to soil type or pH; an average potting soil should work just fine.

There are many factors that will affect the ultimate height, spread and overall performance of a plant when grown indoors; among them, the size of the pot it's growing in, the amount of light it receives, watering frequency, the pruning regimen and repotting schedule. Use the information described here as a guideline only; individual performance can and will vary.
